Do you Use RSMMeans O&P Pricing? You have a New and IMPORTANT Option!

Most of us use Bare pricing from RSMMeans. This allows us to control our markups better and use multiple RSMMeans books easier. (Some RSMMeans books use different Overhead & Profit [O&P] pricing: the Facilities and Master Composite, for example.)

But some of us use the O&P pricing for our contracts, or we use it to incorporate subcontractor markups within our line items.

Legacy MLE Totalling Option

We wanted to make sure you were aware of an important option we made available to you last year in Version 2.615 of your Project Estimator. We also want to ensure you understand it! The option is called **Legacy MLE Totalling** and affects how your O&P values are incorporated into your bare material, labor, and equipment (MLE) values.

In the RSMMeans hardcopy books, only the Bare MLE values are printed. The O&P pricing is shown as a total only.

So before Version 2.615, we did not calculate the MLE values represented by the difference between the Bare and O&P pricing in the RSMMeans books. Because it was not specifically published, we did not calculate and provide those values. We simply provided what was in the book. Therefore the difference between these values was represented on the **Cover Page** of your reports as **Other** costs in the **Material, Labor, and Equipment Totals (No Totalling Components)** section (in the bottom left corner).

We heard from many of you that you would like to see those costs calculated and not lumped into **Other**. So we worked with RSMMeans to calculate these values and present them to you correctly. The values are calculated by increasing the material costs by 10%, increasing the equipment costs by 10%, and everything else gets added to the labor costs.

Now, by default we distribute these prices into those MLE values. If you run an **Estimate Details** report (for example) that shows the MLE values for each line item, you will now see that the O&P pricing is distributed into the MLE. So now they will no longer match the Bare values in the book because the O&P difference is calculated and included to correctly represent the O&P values. These values are also included in the MLE values on the **Cover Page** – removing them from the **Other** value. This makes it much nicer to see where your costs really are!

OK, How Does it Look in a Report?

The following table summarizes what the line items would look like in a report. In this example, we are using the 2013 RSMeans Facility line item 09-66-33-13-2200, conductive epoxy-resin terrazzo, epoxy terrazzo, 1/4" thick, conductive, maximum.

Hopefully this table better illustrates our explanation so far. Enabling Legacy MLE Totalling will place all of the O&P value into Other costs. Disabling Legacy MLE Totalling will distribute the O&P values into MLE.

- Bare values will be the same regardless of your option because this only affects O&P values.
- If you would like to calculate your O&P line items like you did before we released Version 2.615, then you would enable Legacy MLE Totalling.
- If you would like to use our new recommended calculations, you would disable Legacy MLE Totalling.

Am I using Normal or Legacy MLE Totalling?

So how do you know if you are using Legacy MLE Totalling or not? By default we turn the Legacy MLE Totalling off. So by default, the O&P will be calculated and included in the MLE costs. If it is turned on, the main program bar will include "**[Legacy MLE Totalling]**" in the window title.

Only 4Clicks can change this setting. If you'd like it changed, please just let us know!

Which Way Should I be Using?

Most people do not use Legacy MLE Totalling. However, there may be reasons when it might be desired.

If you are using O&P pricing, it may be very important how this information is provided to you. If you are on a unit price book (UPB) contract that specifies O&P pricing, you may want **Legacy MLE Totalling** enabled. This might allow you to examine the Bare MLE values to ensure your UPB pricing has not been altered. Of course, since you're using Project Estimator, we already do that for you. On specific reports if a line item is not printed in the **Alternates** section, you can be ensured it is from your UPB.

Are you tired of seeing values attributed to **Other** costs? Then you would want to ensure that **Legacy MLE Totalling** is disabled.

If you use the scheduling or other spreadsheet exporting tools to examine your costs more finitely, you may want those O&P values distributed correctly as well.

We have clients using both options. So based on your needs, just let us know if you need help changing the setting.

Bonus – City Cost Index (CCI) Info

We should mention one more thing here. From your RSMeans guides, you have the ability to integrate CCI values directly into your line items. When you do this, Project Estimator calculates the proper adjustments and includes these in the MLE values.

This is *always* done – regardless of the **Legacy MLE Totalling** setting. Your MLE values will always include CCI adjustments if you integrate your CCI into your line items.

If you use a totalling component to implement your CCI, then your line items would *not* be adjusted by the CCI value.

Which Backup Do I Do When?

Okay, so we let you do a Data Backup, a Maintenance Backup (MBU), and a Contract Backup (CBU). Which backup do I do when?

The Data Backup is the most important backup you can do! This one includes your projects, estimates, and line items. It backs up everything in your data folder. **Please do not assume someone else is doing this!** Sometimes your IT folks set up automatic backups on server, but that is not always the case. If you are on a stand-alone machine, it is even less likely anyone else is backing up your data. How much you are using e4Clicks determines how often you would want to back up. If you are working extensively in it every day, you may want to back up every day. **It is also extremely important to back up your data to a different location (computer, disc, thumb-drive, etc.) than where e4Clicks is located.** You may want to keep your last several backups before you begin overwriting them. This backup is primarily for you, but we can certainly assist you in getting the information you need from it.

IMPORTANT: If you are getting a new machine (or your old one is getting reimaged), please run a Data Backup before you relinquish your old machine. If you can copy the entire **e4Clicks** folder over to the new computer first, that is even better. We may have to update your license, but your data would be intact.

A **Maintenance Backup** is basically a backup of your licensing information. This simply lets us verify your license information and then update it as necessary. These are most commonly run at the beginning of the year when you renew your license. These are shared with us; so we can extend your license.

A **Contract Backup** only includes your contract information. This includes your totalling components, contractors, contracts, and the like. These are most commonly run when you are adding a new contract to your list of contracts – along with associated totalling components and other information. These are shared with us; so we can help you add this information. (You can add this information on your own, but we are here to help if you need us!)

Q & A Corner

Q: When do the CCI updates come out again?

A: If you've been to a training class, you may remember us saying, "1, 2, 5, 8, and 11." The books come out with an initial CCI in January, and then quarterly updates are made from there. You can expect to see the CCI updates by or around the 15th of the following months:

Q1 = February
Q2 = May
Q3 = August
Q4 = November

Q: We lost our e4Clicks. Can you get it back for us?

A: This is a loaded question for sure, and the answer isn't always good news here. Each build is individualized and built from scratch. We do a lot of work to set up each one of you. So there may be a rebuild charge to set you back up. And we can only return you to the state when we originally set up your build (or update) – unless you have any data backups.
